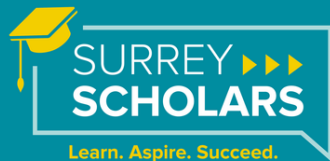

Our mission is to minimise the barriers to education for marginalised and underrepresented learners through outreach activity and advocacy, building a connected community that fosters a sense of belonging and empowers learners to access higher education.

We are proud to engage with learners across our four access initiatives; **Surrey Scholars, Surrey Stars, Kings College Guildford Partnership** and **Your Future** before supporting eligible applicants to enrol at the University of Surrey through **In2Surrey** with a contextual offer. In our annual report, we are delighted to present our impact as recorded across and during the 2022/23 academic year.

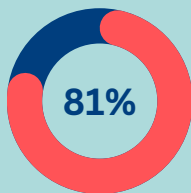
Our impact

4 in 5 Surrey Scholars progressed to Higher Education*

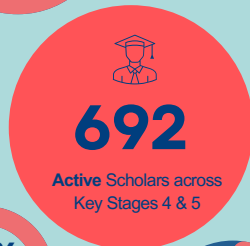

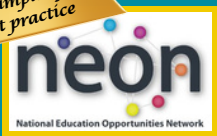

Explore University

130 visitors attended our community day at the University of Surrey to explore post-16 and post-18 pathways through interactive workshops, stands and campus tours and sessions delivered by the University of Surrey and external speakers.

Guests highlighted that the day motivated them to consider their future options, the support available and the types of careers a degree could lead on to.



Your Future

Our community based programme works collaboratively with third party and voluntary sector organisations across Surrey to increase awareness and confidence amongst under-served communities to pursue pathways within further and higher education .

Creativity Unbound

31 prisoners completed a 6-week creative writing programme within HMP Downview to increase confidence in writing, performance and expression.

The ‘Your Future’ Programme

128 refugees and asylum seekers attended events organised in collaboration with either Big Leaf Foundation, HEON or the ESOL Team at Brooklands College. These included English and Maths masterclasses, tri-campus visits, sports days and a non-residential summer school.

Our Surrey community

The WPO Team supports University of Surrey students with their application and with part time work. In2Surrey is a contextual offer scheme, enabling eligible applicants to receive a reduced entry requirement and support with the transition into Higher Education. The Student Ambassador scheme employs students to work on outreach and recruitment events.

I found out about In2Surrey on the University of Surrey website for information on vet school applications. I remember thinking how validating it felt to have my application and individual circumstances actually listened to.
